"RESURGAM"

In 1666, the Great Fire of London swept through the City of London destroying centuries of history in a handful of days. Enter Christopher Wren, Surveyor-General to the Crown and all-round scientific genius. Of the 87 City churches destroyed in the Great Fire, Wren designed and rebuilt 51. His churches were clean, "full of light and clarity and common sense". The crowning glory was the biggest project of them all, St.Paul's Cathedral, topped off by a huge dome, and completed in 1708. To commemorate the Great Fire - which had given him so much employment - Wren constructed The Monument, at the time the tallest column in the world, topped off by a gilded fiery urn. At 202 feet high, if it ever fell on its side, the fiery urn would land in Pudding Lane, where the Great Fire had begun.

Our sketchcrawl begins here at The Monument. We will sketch either solo or in groups, as you prefer. Overleaf is a map of Wren's remaining church buildings in the City; you don't have to sketch all of them! But see how much of Wren's London you can draw today. We will reconvene at 4:00pm outside the front of St. Paul's, where we will share sketchbooks and see what we have drawn. If you like, we may go for a quick pint at the Old Bell Tavern, a pub built by Wren himself, on Fleet Street near St. Bride's.
